Master of Education (MEd) Concentration in Education Administration





The AIU Master of Education with a concentration in Higher Education Administration is designed to help candidates work to develop a solid foundation of professional skills and prepare to pursue careers in education administration or organizational leadership. In addition to the MEd curricula, this concentration provides an additional component that focuses on administration processes and regulations specific to educational institutions, which is vital in a leadership role.

The program features online courses that focus on instructing candidates to utilize industry-authentic tools and develop career-relevant skills in preparation for the next steps in their career path. The Education Administration concentration explores how to collaborate in a community of adult students while studying human resources management, financial administration, regulation and compliance, and the development of curriculum and e-learning solutions for school, faculty, staff and students.

CURRICULUM INCLUDES

AlU's MEd with a concentration in Education Administration emphasizes the practical implications of cognitive science, learning and educational leadership models, legal and regulatory requirements, human and facility resources management, and e-learning best practices. The concentration courses are designed to provide an opportunity for candidates to directly engage in the various components necessary for leadership and administration of educational institutions, such as:

Analysis, Assessment, and Evaluation: covers methodologies used in curriculum decision-making, incorporating educational research and data analysis in context with comparisons between formative and summative assessment and evaluation. This course explores the development of comprehensive educational curricula and various teaching and curriculum design practices based on data analysis.

Education Administration Dynamics and Culture: examines educational leadership models, their underpinning theories, and their applications in current educational settings. The course is designed to help candidates prepare to pursue operational and strategic leadership roles as professionals in the education field.

Personnel and Human Resources: examines the process of human resource planning and financial management in educational organizations, including recruitment, training and development, motivation and retention, budgetary concerns, and performance appraisals. The course provides an overview of financial and human resource administration.

Financial Management: examines financial management processes specific to educational organizations, including recruitment and hiring costs, training and development investments, motivation and retention initiatives, budgetary concerns, and academic and facility resources. The course addresses evaluation, problem-solving, and educational leadership administration of financial assets.

The program culminates in a capstone project akin to a thesis, which will provide real-world experience while encouraging the fluid integration of knowledge.

- Integrate continuous improvement, learner assessment, technology, eLearning, and evaluation plans based on data analysis.
- Identify factors and components to considering education program planning, such as community, regulatory agencies, organizational hierarchy and governing boards.
- Evaluate a collective bargaining contract from both a human resources and union perspective.
- Discuss legal and regulatory requirements of educational financial management.
- Justify educational decision-making based on educational budgeting models.
