## **American InterContinental University – Retention Rates (First time undergraduate Bachelor’s degree student retention rates)**

American InterContinental University’s retention rate is based on students who enrolled at American InterContinental University during the period of July 1 – October 15, as reported to the **Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)**. The students contained in the calculation only represent a subset of the AIU student population as a whole. The student subset below did not attend another college or university prior to enrolling in a Bachelor’s Degree program at American Intercontinental University. The calculation reflects the percentage of students who began their studies in the fall and continued their studies as of the following fall. This is the most current retention data available as last collected by IPEDS during their 2017-18 collection.
